#### **SUMMER LUNCH PROGRAM**

A five-week Summer Lunch Program was organized by our Outreach Ministry for the month of August. An average of 28 children and adults were served lunch every weekday for an average of 140 per week. Over 1049 meals were served in 6 weeks! Our church hosted the lunches and donated and served on Mondays. Four area churches volunteered one day per week to donate and serve lunch. They were First United Methodist, United Church of Christ, St. Paul's Lutheran, and St. Joseph's Catholic.



# **PRAYER SHAWLS**

Pastor Gilmore dedicated our current supply of prayer shawls on July 23. Church family members who love to knit/crochet create prayer shawls using donated yarn. Each stitch represents a prayer by our members. Finished shawls are offered in a basket in our Narthex to anyone wanting to give a shawl to people going through difficult times. The shawls are given along with a note telling the recipient that our church is praying for them.
